


# **Education Resource Manual**

## Resource Offerings by Site

#### Early Childhood Education Center (ECEC)

#### Early Childhood Education Center (ECEC)

- a. **Program Description:** The Early Childhood Education Center provides high quality early childhood education to families with children from prenatal through age 4 years. In addition to an individualized curriculum, the program has extended day hours for children of parents/guardians who are working or in school full-time. There is no fee for the regular schools hours; families pay a co-payment for the extended fay care which is based on family income. Another program option is the home-based program which includes parent educators who conduct home visits with children from birth to 3 years.

#### Early Head Start Program

- a. Program Description: The Home Based Program is an option for pregnant women and families with children age newborn 3 years who do not attend the Early Childhood Education Center. Children may remain in the wait list for the center while participating in the Home Based Program. Families in Home Based are considered to be part of the "ECEC Family" and are invited to all school events, classes and workshops. Children receive the same developmental and health screenings as children attending in the classrooms. Parent Educators visit families with children weekly for 90 minutes in their home and provide learning activities as well as information about health, parenting, nutrition and child development. Twice a month, families that are enrolled in the program are invited to get together for a play time or field trip. Pregnant women meet a Parent Educator twice a month and gain information about prenatal health and development. Parent Educators connect families to resources and services within and outside of the community.

#### Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports

- a. **Program Description:** A 6-week parenting class at the Early Childhood Education Center focused on child development, positive discipline and behavior management offered only to parents enrolled at the Early Childhood Education Center or Early Head Start Home Based program. PBIS will provide parents with information on: How to promote children's social and emotional skills. How to understand their problem behavior. How to use positive approaches to help children learn appropriate behavior. Childcare available upon request. Receive dinner and a book every week!

#### First Things First Summer Transition to Kindergarten Program

- a. **Program Description:** The intent of the evidence-informed Summer Transition to Kindergarten program is to provide classroom experiences for 30 children and their families in the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Region who may not have had any preschool experiences in order to prepare for the transition to kindergarten. The expected result is that children and their families are more prepared for the school-based environment and learning activities upon entry into kindergarten. Registration begins in March and requires a complete school registration packet. The program operates Monday through Thursday in the month of June from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM. The program is free and breakfast and lunch are provided.

I provide in-class support for English/Language Arts, as well as small group, and one-on-one instruction in all contact areas. I assist in making accommodations to assignments and test, as needed. I also work on developing Behavior Improvements Plans (BIPs) for students with emotional disabilities. I oversee the development and updating of student's Individual Education Plans (IEPs) annually, monitor and report on progress toward IEP goals, quarterly, and facilitate triennial testing in conjunction with the Schools Psychologist to determine eligibility for continuation of services.

#### Salt River Jr. ACE Program

- **Program Description:** The Salt River Jr. ACE Program is a collaborative venture involving Scottsdale Community College and the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community (SRPMIC). The project engages middle school students (5<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> grades) in a bridge program that provides them with experiences that will help retain students through middle school and creates a pathway to the high school ACE program, and then on to postsecondary education at a college or university. The college going preparation program operates the first full week of June and Monday through Thursday the second week of June. Retention activities occur in fall and spring for enrolled students and families. The program has a STEM focus along with a college and career focus with an emphasis on the SRPMIC.
